## Basketball Team Drops Two Abounds Here

The Comet basketball team found South Dakota upsetting after the team suffered two losses, dropping to 0-4 in the conference. Friday night the Comets traveled to Yankton College and were defeated by a score of 81-65. The Comets were plagued by a definite height disadvantage with Yankton's Becker breaking the conference record for number of rebounds in one game. Top scorers for Concordia were Dennis Will and Mel Riley, each with 14 points. Saturday night the Comets met Sioux Falls and again were at a height disadvantage with a stiff defense and a sharp offense. Sioux Falls forced the Comets to give up the ball 17 times, with the final score of 105-78. Top scorer for Concordia was again Dennis Will with 12 points, followed by Lefelt Jackson with 11. John Schultz, Kriss Erickson and Mick Rembold hefted ten points each. The Comets' season record stands at 5-9.

With only one night of games left, City Two has the championship wrapped up, followed by the Student Teachers.

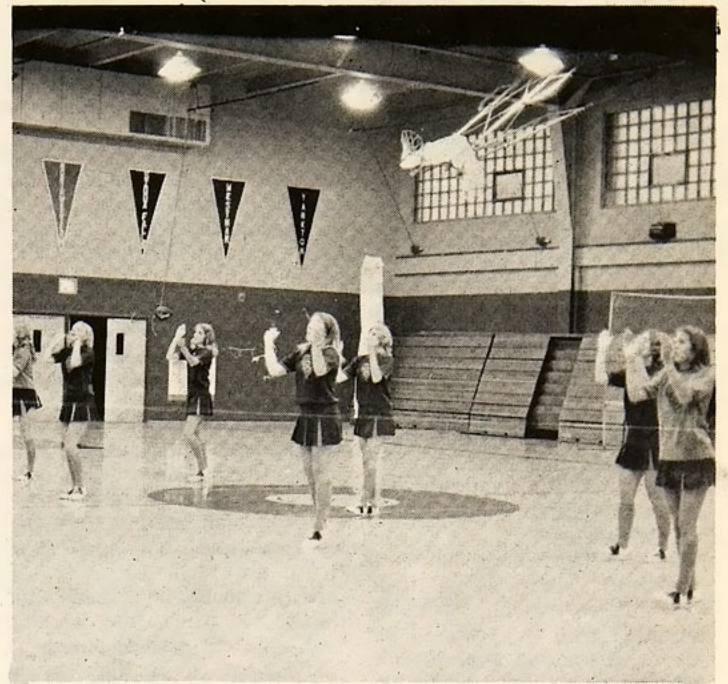
Following the regular season, there will be a tournament, involving nine of the eleven teams. In addition to a championship, there will also be a consolation playoff.
