Watches & Warnings

There is an important distinction: In **Watches** you must plan! In **Warnings** you must act! Keep a radio handy. Your ultimate safety may depend on the information you can receive.

TORNADO WATCH . . . PREPARE!

A **Tornado Watch** means current weather conditions could produce a tornado. Decide now! Where will you go? Clear the stairway to your basement. Is a flashlight handy? Parents should know the whereabouts of their children. Travelers should learn the names of the counties, towns and highways so they can interpret weather information.

TORNADO WARNING . . . ACT NOW!

A **Tornado Warning** means a tornado or funnel cloud has been sighted or detected on radar. At home, go to a storm cellar or basement. In school, follow advanced plans to an interior hallway on the lowest floor. Stay out of auditoriums, gymnasiums and large open rooms that are poorly supported. In office buildings, go to an interior hallway or to the designated shelter area. In shopping centers go to the designated shelter area . . . NOT to your car. In your mobile home, go to a storm shelter. In your car, drive away from the path of a tornado at a right angle.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING ... BE READY!

A **Severe Thunderstorm Warning** means the National Weather Service expects thunderstorms with large hail and/or damaging winds in excess of 57 miles per hour. Frequent lightning is likely. A tornado is possible. Warning sirens usually do not sound. Be prepared to take cover very quickly.

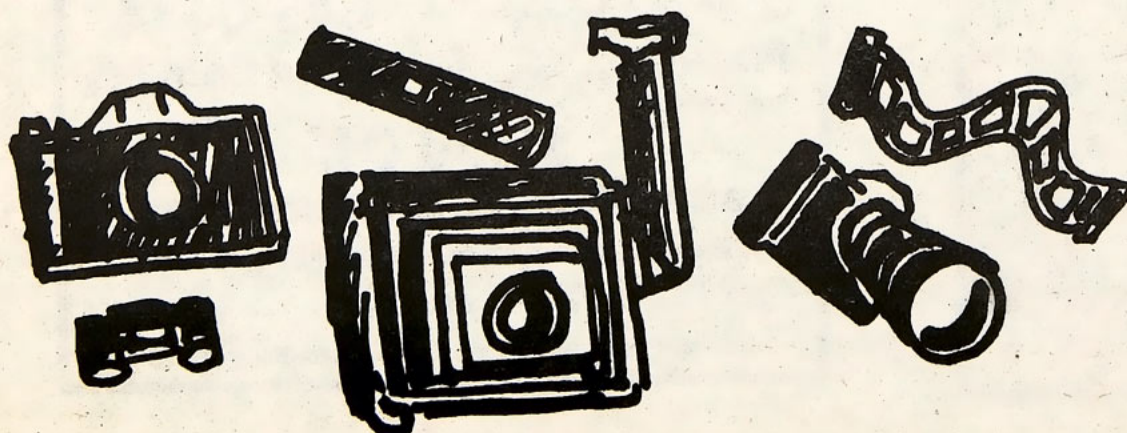
When you hear warning sirens, move to safety. Stay away from windows. Curl up so that your head and eyes are protected. Turn on your radio for official warning information.
