Regulation time ended with the score tied, and it was decided that two 15-minute overtime sessions would be played.

During overtime, it was a battle of both offense and defense as no goals were scored, leaving the Comets with a tie and a 1-4-1 record. †

Mequon and the tie with Northwestern along with them.

The team is making a statement about Concordia spirit and pride with their enthusiasm on and off the field. With encouragement and support from the community here at Concordia, the women's soccer program may develop into a varsity squad next year. †
