Students had to stand in line at the Office of Financial Management, unsure of whether or not they were expected to have a number. This line was to make "arrangements" for their fall quarter bill. In other words, if students had not paid their entire bill or the college had not received all financial aid, they were required to stand in this line.

Before students could pick up their keys or eat meals, the line had to be dealt with. That meant that family and friends had to wait several hours to help students move into their rooms. Those commuters who had not planned on spending the afternoon loitering in the hallway, were late for work and other appointments.

This problem could have been prevented if OFM would have planned ahead. Returning students who were here for athletic camps and retreats should have been notified about the check-in process. These students did not know about the check in process until the Dining Hall required a student identification. Why weren't these students notified about this process before other students arrived? It would have saved both the students and OFM's employees time and trouble.

I also feel that it would have been helpful to have more than one computer terminal approving agreements. There could have been various check-in stations for the different problems. Some students took up to fifteen minutes with their arrangements. Others stood in line for two hours for a five minute meeting.

I really feel that students deserve a better and more organized "welcome back." My final question: What is going to happen when permanent identification cards are distributed?
