

# Eight Simple Steps to Studying Abroad!



Are you thinking about studying abroad and wondering where to start? Where to go? What to study? How to pay for it? There are many decisions to make and much information to gather. The following steps are the starting point for planning your exciting study abroad experience!

## 1. Make a list of your goals for study abroad: Prioritize as to what is most important.

Examples of things to consider: country of study, language of study, subject of study, term, weather and season and the desired experiences you want to have abroad (travel, program support, excursions, courses taught in English...).

#### 2. Search for programs that match your goals:

A great place to start is by filling out the questionnaire provided by the CALL Center (LU 113, or email Abroad@csp.edu).

#### 3. Meet with a staff member:

Once you have narrowed your search, come and meet with a program associate in the Off-Campus Programs Office to assist you with all aspects of your study abroad experience.

#### 4. Meet with your academic advisor:

Meet with your academic advisor to select the courses you will take while abroad and discuss requirements to fulfill your degree at Concordia University. You are also en couraged to discuss the semester you will return to Concordia with your advisor as you will most likely be registering for that semester while you are abroad.

#### 5. Talk with the Financial Aid Office:

You will want to ensure your financial aid is in place and transferrable for your study abroad experience. Federal and state financial aid may apply, but note that Concordia University scholarships and grants do not apply to off-campus study.

#### 6. Apply!

Apply for selected study abroad program and check the expiration date of your pass port. Renew if necessary and for those of you that don't have a passport... Apply for one!

#### 7. Book Flight and Travel:

Reserve your flight and travel arrangements if they are not paid for and organized by your program.

#### 8. Pack and Prepare:

Pack light and prepare for an experience of a lifetime!
